

## **The policy for recognition of llamas registered with the International Llama Registry:**

### **Foreign and Imported Llamas**

Foreign and imported Llamas eligible for registration as purebreds in the CLAA Herd book are as follows:

Any llama registered in the Herd Book of the International Llama Registry (ILR) with an “R” category status that has at least three generations of individually registered ancestors all designated as an “R” category llama.

The following rules shall apply to applications for registration of foreign or imported llamas:

- the llama shall be permanently identified with a microchip in the manner designated by the Canadian Llama and Alpaca Association bylaws
- application for registration shall be made on a prescribed form and shall be accompanied by the animal’s registration certificate issued by the ILR and showing the applicant to have ownership
- the llama shall be DNA parent verified to both dam and sire by a Laboratory accepted by the Association and all costs shall be borne by the applicant
- the llama shall be screened by a CLAA certified screener and pass the screening standards adopted by the Association in conjunction with the breed-up program and all costs shall be borne by the applicant

The following rules shall apply to applications for registration of offspring of a foreign dam and sire:

- the dam and sire shall be registered in the Herd Book of the International Llama Registry (ILR) with an “R” category status and shall both have at least two generations of individually registered ancestors all designated with an “R” category
- the llama shall be permanently identified in the manner designated by the CLAA bylaws
- application for registration shall be made on a prescribed form and shall be accompanied by a copy of the dam’s and sire’s registration certificate issued by the ILR
- the llama shall be DNA parent verified to both dam and sire by a Laboratory accepted by the Association and all costs shall be borne by the applicant
- the llama shall be screened by a CLAA certified screener and pass the screening standards adopted by the Association in conjunction with the breed-up program and all costs shall be borne by the applicant

The registration fee for a foreign or imported llama shall be \$100.00 (plus GST).
